Our main aim is to send books to children aged 4-18. All our books are donated, mostly by the local school authorities. We sort and pack the books, aiming to send each institution a mix of textbooks, reference and library suitable for the age group involved. The World Bank then pays for the books to be shipped in the most economical way possible. This means sending a 20 foot container of approximately 24,000 books to the recipient country, where a reliable distributor will ensure that the books are shared by as many as 60 different schools and institutions.

We are sorry not to be of more help, but wish your Center every success in the future.

Firstly, on behalf of my institution, I would like to express my great grateful for your kindness sending us some books. I am so sure that the books will be very useful for our readers. Since our institution is an educational foundation, our main readers are the students of Junior High School, the teachers and the staffs. They are, now, the members of our library.

As soon as we received the books, we made some preparations such as :

1. Registering the books

This was done to identify the total number of the books, the kinds of books, the source of the books, and other specification of the books.

2. Labelling

We labelled the books based on the registration number and the classification number (using Dewey Decimal Classification). We also put our official stamp on the books to identify that the books now belong to our institution. This done to avoid losing them.

3. Making Catalogues

Catalogues were made to make the readers easy to find the books they want just by looking at the Subject or the author of the books on the catalogues. Then we put the catalogues on the catalogue shelf.

After doing the steps above, we then put the books on the shelf orderly based on their classification. In this case, the books are ready to be read or lent by the readers.

We would also like to inform you that as soon as the books were ready, our readers tried to find and read those books very enthusiastically. It seems that they like those books very much. Unfortunately, one thing that now becomes a problem is that those books are written in English, so most of our readers do not understand much. The only way to overcome this problem is just by consulting much to the English teachers as well as dictionaries.

Due to the problem above, we would like very much to ask for another contribution in the form of fund if any. We need fund to purchase many kinds of books written in Indonesia or English books have been translated into Indonesia.



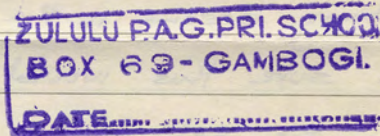
other learning institutions. Other important reference books that the school lacks includes: Dictionaries, Atlases, Wall maps and encyclopedias just to mention a few.
